

Too many times I have had to write in my Curator's Corner about the passing of one our beloved and dedicated volunteers. In this article, I need to mention three such people. Over the last few months Marj Brundage, Perry Hodies and Dick Ortli have all died.

Marj had not been able to volunteer for several years because of her health. However, before that she was docent and served on the Long-Range Planning

committee when it first started in the late 1990s. Among its many goals, the Long-Range Plan called for an expansion of the museum which ultimately resulted in the Transportation Museum. Marj had a deep interest and knowledge of Logan County history. I'm sure she was influenced by her mother Louise Underwood who was a longtime and active member of the Historical Society.

Perry and Barb Hodies moved full-time to Florida a few years ago. We have missed them greatly over that time and have enjoyed their few visits back home. Perry and Barb were one of the first couples I got to know when I first became curator/director. Ever since then I have described them as the nicest people I have ever met. Perry was a docent for us and a valued member of the Building Committee. However, what I remember most about Perry was the way his face would light up when he talked about growing up at the amusement park at Indian Lake. He brought the amusement park to life for those who remembered it and even those of us who had never seen it.

Dick Ortli's death was a shock to all of us. Dick left an indelible impression on the Logan County History Center. As a member of the Building Committee he helped lay the floors in the lobby & Presidents' Room, worked on the caboose, installed doors, made numerous repairs and much, much more. As a monthly docent, he showed scores of people through the museum. Perhaps the greatest mark Dick left at the Logan County Historical Society was the history he taught the hundreds of students he led through the museum as one of our most dedicated and available student tour guides. Dick was a great person and he will be missed.

Our thoughts are with Richard Brundage and family, Barb Hodies and family, and Pat Ortli and family. Marj, Perry and Dick will be remembered very fondly by their Logan County Historical Society family.

An Artist in Every Sense of the Word

Webster's New World Dictionary defines an artist as:

- 1) "a person who works in, or is skilled in the techniques of, any of the fine arts, esp. in painting, drawing, sculpture, etc."
- 2) "a person who does anything very well, with imagination and a feeling for form, effect, etc."


You can add photography and musical ability to the first definition and change "anything" to "everything" in the second definition and they would both describe Warren Sibley Cushman perfectly. Cushman was a prominent artist of this area whose works hung in the Corcoran Gallery in Washington D.C. and whose portrait of President Rutherford B. Hayes is in the White House.


Warren Sibley Cushman was born in Woodstock, Champaign County, Ohio in 1845. He served as regimental bugler in the 134th Ohio Voluntary Infantry during the Civil War. Cushman also worked at several area resorts such as Springs Hotel, Silver Lake and Orchard Island. From 1883-1890 Cushman taught art and music in Springfield.

During his career Cushman made around one thousand paintings and many sculptures, including the statues of the sailor and soldier that once stood at Memorial Hall, and the elaborate Cushman family sculpture at the Woodstock Cemetery. His painting, Spanish Dancing Girls, was exhibited at the 1893 Chicago

World's Fair (Columbian Expedition). It later sold for more than \$10,000.

Dr. Earl Sloan, of Sloan's Liniment fame, was a patron of Cushman commissioning the artist to paint several portraits, including the one of Dr. Sloan that is hanging in the hallway of the Logan County Museum. Sloan also had Cushman supervise the interior decoration of his home in New Bern, North Carolina.






