BRINGING THE ORR MANSION **BACK TO ITS**

ORIGINAL GRANDEUR

We would like to give you an update on the Logan County Historical Society's multi-year restoration/repair plan for the exterior of the 114-yearold Orr Mansion. As you know in the last several years, we have installed a

new tile roof and had the railings and balusters replaced on the front porch. This past fall Jason Kuba of Urban Renovation & Development in Bellefontaine installed new columns on the front porch and repaired and rebuilt the 3rd-floor ballroom dormers. If you haven't seen these recent repairs, you are in for treat. They look great! Jason will continue working on the mansion's exterior this year. This work will include replacing the columns and other repairs on the portico on the mansion's west side. More work will follow over the next couple of years on the 2nd and 3rd floor porches.

While the pandemic delayed some of our fundraising plans to help pay for this work, we are now ready to officially kickoff our Pillars of History Campaign. Soon we will be reaching out to local businesses, organizations and individuals asking them to become a "Pillar of History" by sponsoring the work described above, and other exterior work that needs to be done. 
in the top part have a connection to Indian Lake's history.

Brown Park is located in the east-central part of Bellefontaine off of East Sandusky Avenue. In 1881, the 2.5-acre park was a gift to the City of Bellefontaine from Mrs. Rebecca Shaw Brown. The park was formally dedicated in 1883 by Mrs. Brown in honor of her late husband, Dr. Benjamin Stanton Brown.

Dr. Benjamin Brown was born in 1800 and died in 1873. Dr. Brown was one of the early physicians in Bellefontaine and was the first Logan County surveyor. He was commonly referred to as "director of the town". He opened Bellefontaine's the first drug store in 1844, was a County Recorder, and the county's weatherman. He was also one of founders of the Logan County Fair in 1849.

Brown Park features a life size marble statue of Dr. Brown that was sculptured in Italy. The statue is mounted on bara granite from Vermont and weighs 1,870 pounds. Total cost of the statue being sculpted and set in place was \$2,200.

U.S. Representative and Bellefontaine native, General. Robert P. Kennedy, gave the opening address: "He who gives to the world the example of true manhood, and leaves behind him upon leaving it, the memory of a life well spent, has given it the richest legacy it is possible for him to have left, and made it better because he was a part of it".


The original park featured a greenhouse and numerous flower gardens and benches. A year after the park was established a second greenhouse had to be built to raise all the flowers needed for the gardens. It is not known when the greenhouses were removed, however, in a newspaper article in 1917 it was noted that "the greenhouse in Brown Park needed repair and a new boiler".

When Mrs. Brown died in 1870, she bequeathed her home to the Methodist Church to be used as their parsonage. Her will also contained plans to build a "Museum of Natural Curiosities" in Brown Park that would feature her husband's collection of shells and their cabinets and her many bookcases filled with books. After her death the money for the project came up missing, the shells were lost, and the museum was never built.

In 1894, a goldfish pond and fountain were erected in the center of the park encircled by a protective fence. The fountain was built from rough rock and designed to represent a crag with water trickling out from between the rocks. Benches were placed around the fountain area for visitors to sit and enjoy the goldfish and the beauty of the park.

In 1946, the Ministerial Association had a concrete platform constructed around Dr. Brown's statue. For many years Brown Park has been a cultural arts center for concerts, outdoor theater, and religious services. The park provides a peaceful place to relax amid the hustle and bustle of the city.
